

Why so many churches? And so many divisive labels on churches? You'd think we could get our act together and be one church.

But how good would that be? I drive by a little church in the country and see an older gentleman out mowing the yard. He's big, in a little church. Every congregations has its leaders, visions, griefs, dreams, memories. Such a wonder.

Denominations must puzzle or grieve God or maybe God chuckles, especially over the ones who think We're right and everybody else is wrong. We all apprehend God partially, truly in some aspects, and yet darkly confused in other ways. To me, that's the humbling beauty of so many churches.

Paul taught us to think of the Church as a Body, not all fingers or elbows or knees, but differing parts, together making up the whole. Are denominations like this? Pentecostals are not like the Presbyterians, and AMEs are not like the Lutherans - and yet, they are very much alike, and they certainly need each other. Catholics and Baptists seem light years apart - but then are strangely similar. All denominations strive with resolute energy to follow Christ. Each one has a different angle on the multifaceted orb that is the kingdom of God. The Baptists know the centrality of the Bible. The Quakers embrace the need for silence. Methodists try to engage societal challenges. The Catholics embody the rich tradition of the faith and the need for saints. The non-denominational denominations creatively reach people wary of the encrustations of churchiness. Mennonites are humble, Presbyterians use

their brains, and the AME Zions can outsing us all.

As soon as I've said this, I shudder. Methodists want to be Bible people; we need saints; we have brains; we sing pretty well. Maybe as we watch one another, we stretch and grow. We mainliners who are stiffly fixed in our pews need a little liberation from the Pentecostals so we too can show a little emotion and move, if only a little bit. The evangelicals want to save souls, while some of the more "liberal" groups want to administer medicine and food. Surely both are needed. Independent congregations can teach us all to take initiative, while connectional churches with bishops and even a pope can expand our vision and help us realize we are part of something bigger, that we in fact have in common the only thing that really matters.

Way better than passing judgment on one another, trumpeting our superiority, suspiciously eyeing those who think differently. The "competition" is never the church across the street, but that manyheaded monster of cynicism, hollowness, violence, greed, hedonism, selfishness, disbelief.

Yes, it's embarrassing that we have black churches and white churches, wealthy churches and poor churches. God, I'm sure, would prefer we mix it up a bit. But our dream is that in our crazed variations we will be able to counter the discomfort of those who are a little hesitant by saying, "There is a place for you." Because, after all, church matters. All the churches matter. James


